<p>Barolo Le Coste di Monforte, Silvano Bolmida 2017</p> <p>Le Coste di Monforte is at the southern limit of Barolo DOCG, facing Ginestra to the north and Francia in Serralunga to the east. Silvano's long gentle maceration and slow development in older barrels has given great balance to this very classy wine, with a bouquet of black cherry, rose petal and autumnal leaves. Drink from 2022 to 2027.</p>	6	£95
<p>Barolo Acclivi, GB Burlotto 2017</p> <p>Fabio Alessandria's wines have exceptional bouquet and precision and this one, made using grapes from his different vineyard sites in Verduno, offers great richness and harmony, and will age happily for a decade at least. Drink from 2023 to 2032.</p>	3	£100
<p>Barolo Monvigliero, GB Burlotto 2017</p> <p>Monvigliero is Verduno's most famous vineyard and Fabio's wine (the grapes for which are foot trodden during the fermentation) has a remarkable fragrant bouquet and persistent haunting flavour. Drink from 2023 to 2032.</p>	3	£110
<p>Barolo, Ciabot Berton 2017</p> <p>This has a lovely ripe red-fruited perfume, polished present tannins and a long floral nervy finish, showcasing the lighter touch and fresh appeal of Barolo from western hills. Drink from 2022 to 2027.</p>	6	£115
<p>Barolo del Comune di Monforte, Anselma 2017</p> <p>Maurizio Anselma is in an enviable position with some of the best vineyard sites across Barolo. His mother is the viticulturist and is renowned for her attention to detail. In the cellar Maurizio takes his time with a long fermentation and ageing in old casks leading to this elegant yet powerful rose-and-tar scented classic. Drink from 2022 to 2027.</p>	6	£120
<p>Barolo Riva del Bric, Paolo Conterno 2017</p> <p>Riva del Bric is grown at 350m in Monforte d'Alba and in 2017 it really stood out, laden with cranberry, cherry and rose flavours, firm tannins and a long finish. A Barolo with poise and charm. Drink from 2022 to 2029.</p>	6	£125
<p>Barolo Roggeri, Ciabot Berton 2017</p> <p>Roggeri is one of the top vineyards of La Morra and well known for its compact yet balanced style. Here with sweet red fruit and notes of herbs, spice and dried leaves, and well-integrated tannins, this will hit its stride in five years, but if decanted could be enjoyed sooner. Drink from 2022 to 2032.</p>	6	£125

<p>Barolo Arborina, Nadia Curto 2017</p> <p>Arborina is an outstanding south-facing vineyard in La Morra making Barolo of real charm and approachability. Wild rose and raspberry aromas on the nose, with Ceylon leaf and red-apple notes coming through on the fine-boned, refreshing palate. A great wine offering excellent value and early appeal. Drink from 2022 to 2030.</p>	6	£125
<p>Barolo Rocche dell'Annunziata, Rocche Costamagna 2017</p> <p>This old family estate only uses large Slavonian oak when aging Barolo so not to distract from the fruit. The perfume is complex and classic with rose, cherry, leather and spices. Coiled tannins hold this complex flavour profile well on to the long finish. Drink from 2022 to 2031.</p>	6	£125
<p>2017 Barolo Case</p> <p>Drink from 2022 to 2027. A six-bottle case containing one bottle of each of the following: Barolo Bussia Dardi le Rose, Poderi Colla 2017 Barolo Arborina, Nadia Curto 2017 Barolo Le Coste di Monforte, Silvano Bolmida 2017 Barolo Rocche dell'Annunziata, Rocche Costamagna 2017 Barolo Roggeri, Ciabot Berton 2017 Barolo del Comune di Monforte, Anselma 2017</p>	6	£129
<p>Barolo, Massolino 2017</p> <p>Serralunga is known for its robust structured style and here in a warmer vintage it is supported by plenty of rich ripe fruit. This is the sort of wine which will taste good young, middle-aged or old because of its excellent balance. Drink from 2022 to 2032.</p>	6	£148
<p>Barolo Parafada, Massolino 2017</p> <p>Parafada is Franco Massolino's oldest vineyard, planted in 1960. Its steep slope of chalky soil gives a wine of wonderful precision and class. A textbook example of Serralunga Barolo with wonderful freshness on the finish. Drink from 2024 to 2035.</p>	3	£162
<p>Barolo Parussi, Massolino 2017</p> <p>The Parussi vineyard is located on the western slope of Castiglione Falletto at an altitude of 300m above sea level. Fragrant and firm in style with cherry, red plum, sandalwood and fresh tobacco, this needs a little time to soften. Drink from 2024 to 2034.</p>	3	£162

<p>Barolo Bussia Dardi le Rose, Poderi Colla 2017</p> <p>Tino and Pietro Colla have great expertise with this particular parcel from within the famous Bussia vineyard in Monforte, and the wine really speaks to its place. With tense tannins and firm structure, this will need time, but is already alive with heady herbal, black-tea and cherry aromas, pointing at the wonderful promise for the future. Drink from 2023 to 2033.</p>	6	£165
<p>Barolo Marcenasco, Renato Ratti 2017</p> <p>The Marcenasco vineyard in La Morra has been planted with Nebbiolo since the 12th century, and has been farmed and vinified separately by the Ratti family since 1965. This Barolo has great balance, red-berry and red-apple fruit, complex spice and a firm mid-palate structure. Drink from 2021 to 2030.</p>	6	£165
<p>Barolo Mosconi, Anselma 2017</p> <p>This single-vineyard wine from Monforte d'Alba has an excellent perfume of redcurrant fruit, white-pepper spice, crushed rocks, violets and rose. The firm tannins and brisk acidity are classic to this terroir, and will need a few years to knit. Drink from 2024 to 2032.</p>	6	£175
<p>Barolo Terlo Vigna Costa Grimaldi, Luigi Einaudi 2017</p> <p>This lovely Barolo comes from a site close to the town of Barolo itself in the heart of the region and is especially expressive in the 2017 vintage. Stylish wine with a nose of dried orange peel, morello cherry and fresh tea, with silky firm tannins and excellent balance on the palate. Drink from 2022 to 2030.</p>	6	£180
<p>Barolo Ginestra, Paolo Conterno 2017</p> <p>A beautifully balanced Barolo with a haunting perfumed bouquet and supple multi-faceted palate evocative of balsamic, orange, roses and violets. Ginestra is a great vineyard known for the finesse of its wines and this is a model example showing its quality. Drink from 2023 to 2034</p>	6	£205
<p>Barolo Luigi Baudana, Baudana 2017</p> <p>Baudana is a hidden gem among the historical vineyards of Serralunga. With vibrant concentrated fruit, sweet spice and great firm structure, this 2017 will cellar brilliantly. Drink from 2022 to 2034.</p>	6	£210

<p>Barolo, Pio Cesare 2017</p> <p>Pio Cesare have been making great Barolo for decades and have particularly good sources in Serralunga and Novella which make firm, textbook rose-and-tar scented Barolo. This 2017 has a perfume of fresh tobacco and black tea, with sweet red fruit on the polished, elegant palate. Drink from 2022 to 2034.</p>	6	£215
<p>Barolo Bussia, Luigi Einaudi 2017</p> <p>We have been captivated by Einaudi's wines in recent vintages because they combine power, texture and finesse. Coming from their vines from the best part of Bussia, Dardi, this is no exception, offering richness, salted cherry, leather and red-apple flavours supported by firm tannins that will need a little time. Drink from 2024 to 2034.</p>	6	£230
<p>Barolo Cannubi, Luigi Einaudi 2017</p> <p>Cannubi is known for its distinctive aromatic wines with scents of mint and sage, along with sweet black-fruit flavour. It is a 2.5-hectare vineyard where grapes always ripen well and Einaudi's 45-year-old vines imbue extra depth and richness. Drink from 2023 to 2032.</p>	6	£230
<p>Barolo Bricco Boschis, Cavallotto 2017</p> <p>Traditional in the very best sense, this gorgeous, opulent Barolo redolent of balsamic spices, flowers and black fruits needed its three years in large wood to knit together. Those looking for totemic 'tar and roses' coiled and firm Barolo will find it here – the Saint-Estèphe of Barolo! Drink from 2024 to 2042.</p>	6	£245
<p>Barolo Coste di Rose, GD Vajra 2017</p> <p>Coste di Rose is a hidden gem situated between Cannubi and Bussia in the heart of Barolo: at 400m with sandy soils it is creating very fine nebbiolos. This floral and red-cherry scented wine has notes of liquorish and violets, and a long finish. Drink from 2022 to 2033.</p>	6	£260
<p>Barolo Cerretta, Luigi Baudana 2017</p> <p>This east-facing vineyard is rich in manganese, which seems to lend finesse to the typical Serralunga powerful tannins. The 2017 has a particularly fine bouquet as well as power and structure, with fragrant fruit. It will benefit from five years or more in the cellar. Drink from 2024 to 2037.</p>	6	£265

Rocche dell'Annunziata, within La Morra, is known for its blue marl soil with sand that gives wonderful elegance and complexity to the vines. Spending the first year in French oak barriques and second year in 25-hectolitre Slavonian oak casks, this Barolo has great balance yet notable cedar notes alongside classic rose and tar. Drink from 2024 to 2037.

Barolo Ornato, Pio Cesare 2017

Sourced from three plots within this famed single vineyard, Ornato, in the heart of Serralunga, this top-quality Barolo is made to benefit from long ageing, though perfect balance ensures it will always show its quality. With an intense ripe core of cherry, anise and leather, this has a long life ahead of it. Drink from 2025 to 2037.
